

ASSISTANT TEACHERS are required to have different qualifications in different settings.

The minimum **educational qualifications** for each setting are listed below.

Some settings also require other qualifications as well. See “Notes” and check with the agency that sets to requirements to see these additional requirements. Requirements may change and certain employers may require more than the minimum qualifications.

¹ Child day care centers are licensed by the Connecticut Department of Public Health (DPH). These are the requirements for the individual designated as the “second program person” in a child day care center. This individual must also be at least 18 years old and have 540 hours of documented supervised experience. ² NAEYC accreditation requires 50% of assistant teachers to have a CDA or equivalent (12 credits in ECE that encompass the 5 content areas).
